POLL SHOWS McCAMLEY WINNING BY TWO TO ONE MARGIN

McCamley Winning across Demographic Groups & Regions of the District

(Las Cruces, NM) – A new poll conducted by Greenberg Quinlan Rosner Research for the McCamley for Congress campaign showed Bill McCamley beating opponent Harry Teague by a nearly two to one margin. The findings are based on a survey of 403 likely Democratic primary voters conducted March 17-19, 2008. The survey is subject to a margin of error of +/- 4.9 percentage points.

According to a memo written by the polling firm, “McCamley’s lead over Teague stands at a commanding 43 to 22 percent, before any information about either candidate is introduced.”

The memo notes that McCamley’s strength is not confined to a particular region or group.

“McCamley leads Teague in every demographic group, including Hispanics and Anglos, men and women, and across most of the district. He leads Teague by more than 50 points in Doña Ana County and is tied with him in the eastern part of the district, where Teague lives.”

“Coming right after our resounding victory at the Convention, these poll numbers show that our message is getting out,” said McCamley. “Elections are about earning people’s support. The hard work that our campaign has done to spread our message about fighting for the people shows that we are doing just that.”

McCamley recently won the Democratic Party’s Pre-Primary Convention for the Second Congressional District 49% to Teague’s 36% in a tremendous show of strength.

He has previously received endorsements from 12 current and former elected Democratic officials in the Second District. He has also been endorsed by the New Mexico Building and Construction Trades Council, which represents over 7,000 New Mexico workers.

Since declaring his candidacy in April, McCamley has put over 45,000 miles on his car, traveling to every county in the district to listen to the concerns of constituents. He has also raised \$300,000.

McCamley is a Doña Ana County Commissioner and was Executive Director of the New Mexico Rural Development Council.
